

HARD LANDSCAPING & PLANTING OF GANDY FIELD

The Gandy field slopes gently from north to south and is exposed to full sun for most of the day. The slope enhances this effect. The soil at the northern end, recently cleared of bramble and ivy is light well drained, almost arid, stony and generally of poor quality.

Planting needs to take account of these factors

Additional and shrubs may be purchased and planted within the wild flower area if it is decided to do so. They will need either to be of limited height or on a dwarfing or semi – dwarfing rootstock. Fruit trees for example, grafted to M26 semi – dwarfing rootstock giving a mature height of 8-12 ft when purchased as 1m saplings are about £25 each.
