 $\mathbf{JG}$  - Time capsule is in good condition – need to decide what is placed in it, where it is placed and how long for. One location was suggested in the Roundhouse (where it has been stored for the last 10 years).

**WPC & Art Group** – suggestion of holding workshops to make decorations by yarn bombing or knitting. The Art Group are prepared to do something as well.

**JG** - Summer Santa – Gordon has confirmed that he is interested, suggested the he presents the prizes for the Fancy Dress.

**Weldon in the Woods sign**. 2 quotes have been submitted one from Black Forge Art for £5300 +VAT and the other from Sign of the Time for £3000. JG to contact David James signs for the 3rd.

**PD** to contact Mark McLaughlan, bagpiper, to play at the lighting of the beacon on the Thursday evening.

AP to contact Priors Hall Schools for their involvement

JG confirmed that JD Café, The Shoulder of Mutton, Weldon Village Hall Committee and Londis have agreed to be involved. The Village Kitchen and Tuckers have agreed to help with food as well. The Youth Group are aware of the celebrations. 5th Avenue do not want to get involved. JG has still to contact The George, Lux, Mums & Tots Group, Scout Group and Sunday School for their involvement.

**DP** would like to purchase a marquee, not just for this event but others, would cost somewhere in the region of £700. Need to find somewhere to store it if agreed.

NP suggested that there could be a grant available from Northants Community Foundation,

**Andy W** also offered the use of the Cricket Club marquee if it is raining on the Thursday evening for safety of using electricity.

**Ann W** emailed the Clerk with the following Bunting - the RBL have a lot from the previous events. The owners of military vehicles may want to attend in some capacity as an additional attraction.

**DP** mentioned that there had been a cannon fired at the 401st War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday, may be worth finding out if that could be available too.

**DP** would like Street Parties to be held in Church Walk, and at Glebe Farm in Church Street (Ken Argo has a key). DP was reminded that it would be down to the residents to organise Street Parties and not this committee.

**Andy W** would like to introduce other sports to the Cricket Field in order to utilise the ground all year, some of which may become part of the Jubilee Celebrations.

There has been no response from the article posted in the Winter Edition of Park News.

<u>Gandy Field</u> – to plant a sensory garden work to be carried out by Youth Group, Primary Schools, Weldon British Legion and Residents. Grant to be applied for from NNC Community Grants and Fund.
