We're all looking forward to coming together at St Mary's Church later this term for our first harvest celebration since 2019. We're already practising our harvest songs in our weekly singing assembly so we'll be in fine voice when the time comes.

Lastly, September saw us play host to a series of open evenings for Weldon Village Academy. These were widely attended by families from right across the parish and beyond and we're looking forward to building on our existing relationship with the new school and its team as it grows over the coming months.
