## **22.204** Finance

a) Cllr Taylor gave the following report on behalf of the Finance Committee. There is currently £212111.59 across all 3 bank accounts, the Grass Cutting Grant of £1978.67 has been received along with £75 for another advert in the new edition of Weldon Wide and £495 from Allotment Tenants. For whatever reason the Bank failed to process the original payment of £1794 to Breakthrough Communications so another payment was raised which was processed. However the Bank then processed the original payment. Breakthrough Communications are refunding the payment. Outstanding payments to be approved this evening amount to £6213.23 Once the payments have been approved this evening this will leave £207652.36 across all 3 bank accounts. The VAT refund for October and November has been made for £246.04

- b) **Budget-** The budget estimates and explanation papers that were circulated to all Councillors prior to the meeting were considered. After examining the financial position of the Council, it was proposed that the budget be set at £115000 and that a precept demand under s41 of the Local Government Finance Act 1992 be issued to North Northamptonshire Council for £115000.00 for the year 2022/23 as Weldon Parish Council has calculated that the budget requirement.
- c) There is just one no grant application to consider. £999 towards the cost of the general upkeep of Weldon Village Hall. which was approved.
- d) There is no update on the new kissing gate for the Cricket Field.
- e) The Finance Committee recommends appointing AECOM as Traffic Consultants for the Parish Council at a cost of £13,880 plus VAT, which was approved by everyone present.
- f) It was resolved to purchase 3 new Noticeboards. Mulberry Homes have agreed to fund the cost of one, BAM will meet the cost of the second one to be placed on the Gandy Field and the 3rd will be funded by the Parish Council to be placed by the Post Box on the junction of Hillside Crescent and Corby Road.



g) The Finance Committee is looking into finding office space with storage within the Parish so that the Clerk will no longer be working from home.

**Planning Applications**: Cllr M Page reported there are several new planning applications, including the one discussed at the public session.

They are: NC/22/00389/LBC - Demolish rear sun room and build a single storey extension - 15 Stamford Road,

NC/22/00464/DPA - Erection of 22 discount market sale dwelling houses with associated infrastructure and landscaping - land at Stamford Road (known as Kettering Road) - Objections to be raised.

NC/22/00482/REM - Approval of reserved matter to construction two Neighbourhood Play areas at Weldon Park

NC/22/00491/REM - Local Centre Development to include Nursery, Convenience Store, 3 Retail Units with associated parking and landscaping. The information submitted relates to condition 2, 3, 6, 8. 10, 11, 15, 19, 22 and 25 of 16/00105/RVC at Weldon Park.

NC/22/00465/DPA - Double storey rear extension and roof conversion - 32 East Crescent Weldon - Objections to be raised.

Rockingham Gateway application should be presented at the December Strategic Planning Committee. As part of Section 106 the old farmhouse within the site will be refurbished.
