Minutes of Parish Maintenance Working Party Meeting held on Monday 30th October 2023

PMC.431 Apologies had been received from Mrs Langford and Mr Simon Green which were accepted.

PMC.432 No declarations of interest were raised

PMC.433 The minutes of the meeting held on 25th September were approved.

PMC.434 Items from the **budget** were dealt with one by one and Cllr Shepard agreed to amend as recommended by the members. The Clerk will submit the amended budget to the finance committee on Wednesday 22nd November with a view to the budget as whole being approved at the December Full Council Meeting. It was suggested that some of the mowing equipment will need replacing as they are coming near to the end of their life.

PMC.435 The following work has been carried out since the last meeting

The planters have all been weeded. The self-watering ones have been planted with snowdrops and crocus. The wooden ones on The Triangle and by East Crescent been planted with daffodils and wallflowers. The Rainbow ones have been variously planted with daffodils and alliums. The troughs by the tank have been planted with pansies and crocus. The 2 previously overgrown beds on the Village Green have been dug out and planted with a mix of crocus, alliums and wallflowers. A miniature buddleia has also been planted in each. Some of the trees on the Village Green have been pruned to remove dead branches. Contact was made with Andy Leighton (Kier Customer and Stakeholder Manager) regarding the fact that the hedge alongside the Kettering Road footpath in Weldon village had not been cut at the time the hedge from the village boundary towards Corby was cut. It has subsequently been cut. The Triangle has been planted with additional daffodils and the area under the group of trees planted with English bluebells. The mowing of the grassed areas for which the PC is responsible has continued. Some of the water-meadow area in the Pocket Park has been mown and the grass raked into piles. Grant application for a brushwood mower, garden forks, hay rakes, puddling clay and willow whips was made to Nene Rivers Trust. A decision is expected in about 2 weeks.

PMC.436 Land Registry –Paperwork has been submitted.

PMC.437 Weldon in Bloom -The next meeting is on Monday 13th November in the Cricket Club.

PMC.438 Hills & Hollows - Mr Scott has asked for copies of the current drawings.

PMC.439 Nature Recovery / Parish reWilding - The grant application has been submitted..

PMC.440 Tasks for the Caretaker -

Cut back the basal growth on the Lime trees in the Pocket Park to the trees' main trunk prior to chipping. Collect the rubbish and litter in The Hills & Description (Will need to be delayed until the late autumn as much of what needs to be removed is obscured by vegetation) Shred the growth removed and other twigs and branches already cut and piled up in the Pocket Park. Cut back the basal growth on one of the trees on the piece of land opposite the hairdressers Continue with grass cutting in the village if still needed Refurbish Stamford Road bench and reinstall it when the work is completed. Monitor the state of the Gandy Field and carry out any necessary work

to keep it in a tidy state. 8) Empty the litterbin in the Pocket Park. Lay replacement paving slabs on The Leys side of the footbridge into the Pocket Park Estimate quantity of Hammerite paint needed to paint Village Green railings. Litter-pick Kettering Road from Londis to the pedestrian entry gate to Weldon Woodland Park and remove the branches that have recently fallen from the trees that are lying alongside the footpath. Continue with pruning / removing dead wood from trees on Village Green. Repair wooden footbridge across the pond outlet stream in the Pocket Park (One sleeper was lost due to latest flooding and the other is unseated. Cost to replace the missing sleeper approx. £32 + Vat. If concreted into position to prevent recurrence total cost would be double). Leaf – blow Church Walk and other footpaths as needed.

Other Possible Tasks

Paint all of the metal benches for which we are responsible when the weather permits. Repair pond dam in Pocket Park if grant funding is approved. (Meeting for grant approval is on 9 th November).

Tasks in conjunction with Weldon in Bloom volunteers

Mow the Pocket Park and rake up the cut vegetation. Clear ground on Triangle for new flower bed. (Note – subject to PC approval). Fork over ground around the tank and on The Triangle ready for wildflower seed. Plant wildflower seed in late October. Purchase 12 bags of compost, - (some are needed for winter mulch). Purchase and plant red and orange tulip bulbs in the rainbow bed opposite The George. (expected cost £10 - £12)

- **PMC.441** Report from Tree Warden Nothing new to add
- **PMC.442** Report from Footpath Warden Oundle Road footpath has been repaired however there are still some trip hazards. It was agreed to purchase gravel to lay at the bottom of the Oundle Road/Church Street Jitty as it is filling up with mud.
- PMC.443 Sponsorship Following from the distribution of a letter from the Levelling Up Minister time was spent considering offering to purchase the Rookery if a) Full Council agrees, b) The landowner agrees and c) Funding can be approved. It was also suggested that Cllr Shepard make contact with a Parish Council who have purchased a wooded area via the Levelling Up Fund.
