Surprised by Christmas

What has been the biggest and best surprise

of your life? It seems that in today's world surprises are something to be avoided. We know the gender of a child before it is born, we now tell each other what to get us as presents to avoid getting something wrong. But has that sort of safe living limited our experience of spontaneous joy?

Some 2023 years ago, there was a group of shepherds sitting around a fire, no doubt talking about the hardships they faced under Roman occupation. In a small moment something surprised them – angels appeared, proclaiming "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10).

Surprised and bemused, the shepherds follow the angel's instructions and they find things as they had been told. Suddenly their daily struggles are set aside by the new hope they have found through the child they had visited. This child has given their life in a new and exciting perspective.

The lenses of pessimism are replaced by the spectacle of hope and after such an incredible experience it is hardly surprising. It is recorded that "the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen." (Luke 2:20a).

Maybe the biggest surprise this Christmas is still waiting for you to discover. If you feel you are missing the joy and wonder of Christmas this year, remember the story of the shepherds. Maybe it is time to reacquaint yourself with the Christmas story, so you too can be surprised by Christmas joy. Come and find out why Christmas is cause for celebration in one of our Christmas services, who knows it might be the beginning of the adventure of a lifetime.
